Conference Call for Proposals

You are invited to submit proposals for individual papers/presentations, panels, demonstrations and workshops to engage the audience in the wonder of the country school. Whether one-room, two-rooms, or more, the image of the country school is disappearing from the horizon and the few schools that are left are being preserved because of the work of individuals who value the heritage of this institution.

Presentations should be approximately 20-30 minutes, will be grouped according to topics, and are encouraged in the following strands:

- **Programming** for the country school: coordinating with local school standards, accuracy of period interpretation, staffing, etc.
- **Preservation**, including fund raising, grant writing, and website development
- **Research** on structures, learning activities, and individuals who taught or learned in country schools
- **Demonstration**, reenactments and period displays (may include video and internet presentations)
- **Panel Discussion** addressing issues of interest to country school supporters
- **Workshop** in which you facilitate construction of materials/artifacts/resources for use in programming in a country school (specify time needed)
